The selection committee requires two letters of recommendation commenting on the applicant's abilities and personal character. One of the recommenders must be from a teacher.

In our evaluations, we are using the "compelling case" category in an effort to prioritize inclusivity, diversity, and equity at the Academy. We know and appreciate that definitions of inclusivity, diversity, and equity are broad and varied.
